



Homestay gives you the opportunity to live with an Australian family while you study. This is a great way to develop your English language skills and experience life in Australia. All furniture and meals are provided.









Criminologists work in federal and state justice agencies such as research and statistics institutes, police departments and courts. Correctional authorities also employ criminologists as researchers, assessors and policy advisors, while others might work in private practice providing consulting services for law reform, justice, forensic psychology, behavioural science or crime statistics.
